### <u>Health</u>

There has been cases of conjunctivitis in the school. Please make sure that if your child has symptoms please let your child's teacher know.

### <u>Here is some information regarding</u> <u>conjunctivitis;</u>

Time from exposure to illness: 1-3 days.

*Symptoms:* The eye feels scratchy, is red and may water.

Lids may stick together on waking.

**Do I need to keep my child at home:** Yes, while there is discharge from the eye.

*How can i prevent it from spreading:* Careful hand washing; avoid sharing towels. Antibiotics may be needed.
