#### **Anaphylaxis Update**

We have students with anaphylaxis at our school. This medical condition can be life threatening in some circumstances. We ask all parents and caregivers to ensure they are not packing foods or treats that contain nut products. This means no peanut butter sandwiches, no nutella sandwiches and certainly no nut treats like chocolates with peanuts.

If everyone tries to eliminate the risks,

we can keep all students safe and sound.

We also have a staff member who has anaphylaxis in relation to bananas. At the moment we are managing this situation with the specific class.

High levels of hygiene, including proper handwashing can also reduce the incidence of any anaphylaxis situations in our school.

#### **Daily Attendance At School**

All students need to be at school everyday. If for some reason your child cannot be at school, we need to be notified why your child was away. If you do not provide a reason, your child's absence from school is recorded on their attendance record as 'unjustified'. The Skoolbag app is a simple and easy way to notify us of your child's absence from school. Don't forget that the same rules apply to partial absences. Children

who arrive late by 10 minutes each day, lose an hour of school a week. Over a term, this equates to two whole school days missed! Be on time and ready for learning every day!



#### Respectful Relationships

Imagine going to the shops or your work each day and having people swear at you and threaten you with violence. Sadly, this is what happens on occasion at our school. As a school we promote and endorse respectful relationships and we hope you will support us in this endeavour. There is no justification or excuse for a student to threaten, harass or swear at an adult on the school site. We will take action against this anti-
